

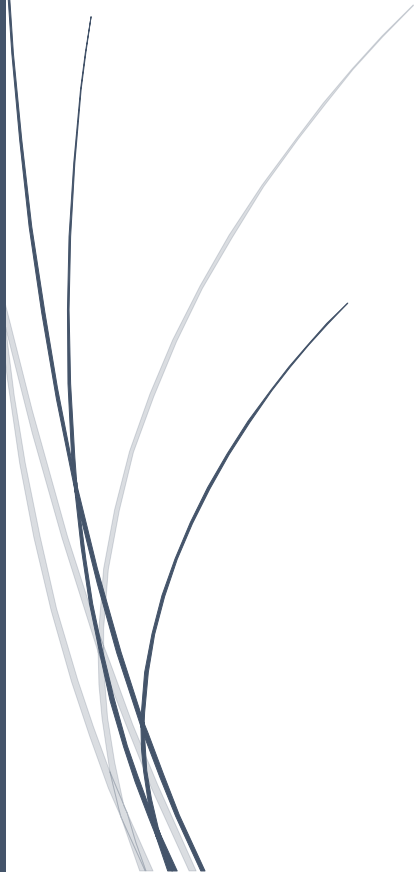

# Layers of the Earth cut and paste activity

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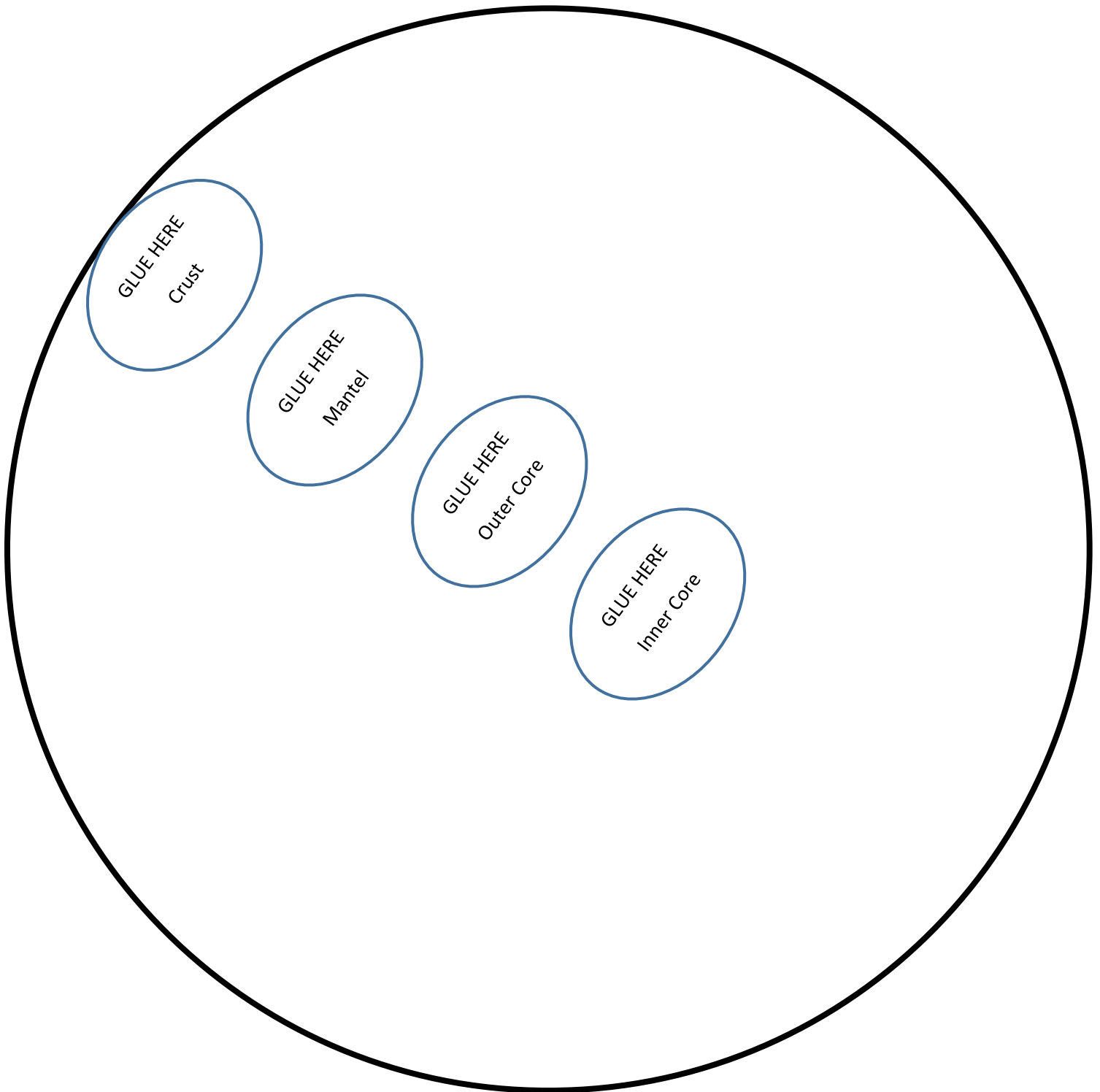

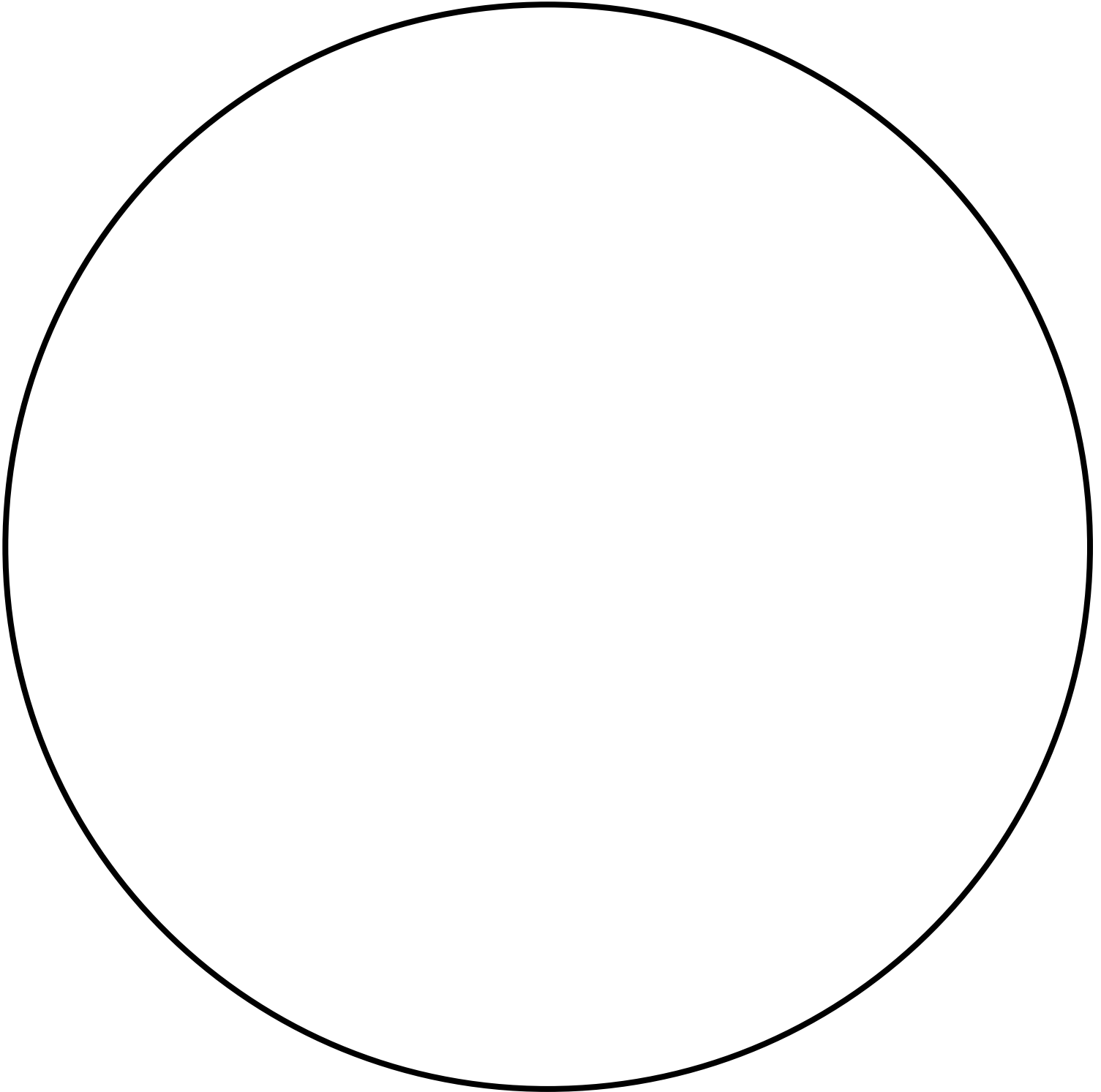

Glue the information boxes on the back of each layer. Once they are all glued together, students can either label, color, or do both to the layers.

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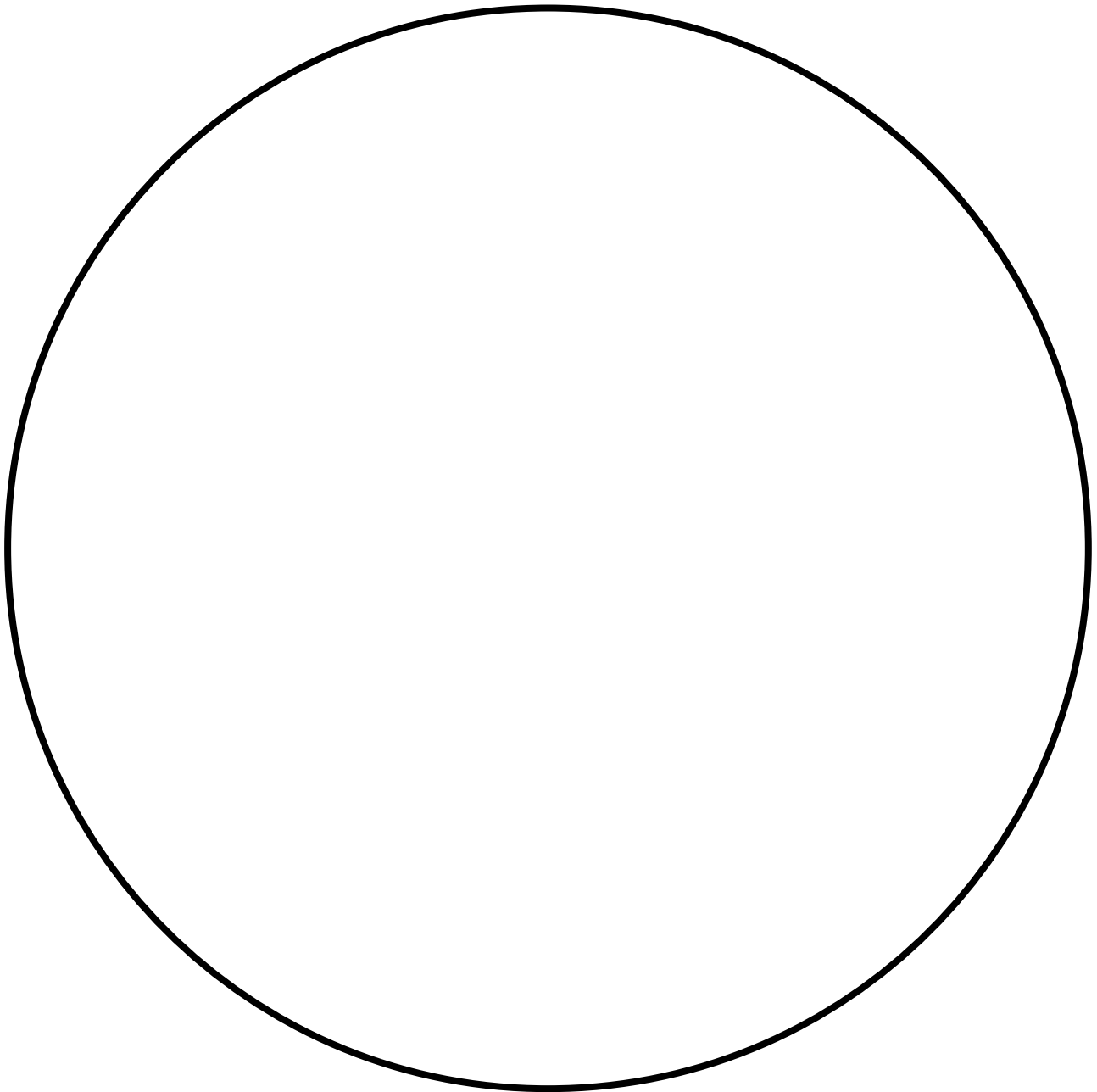
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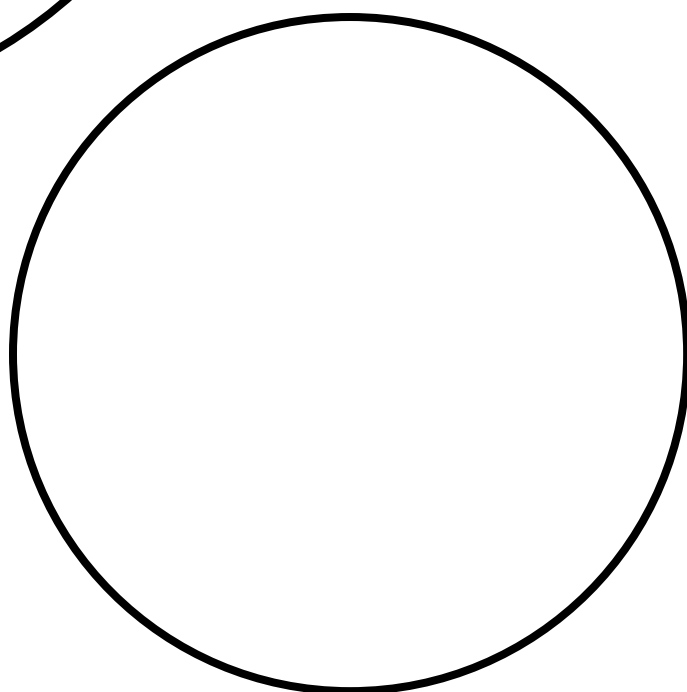
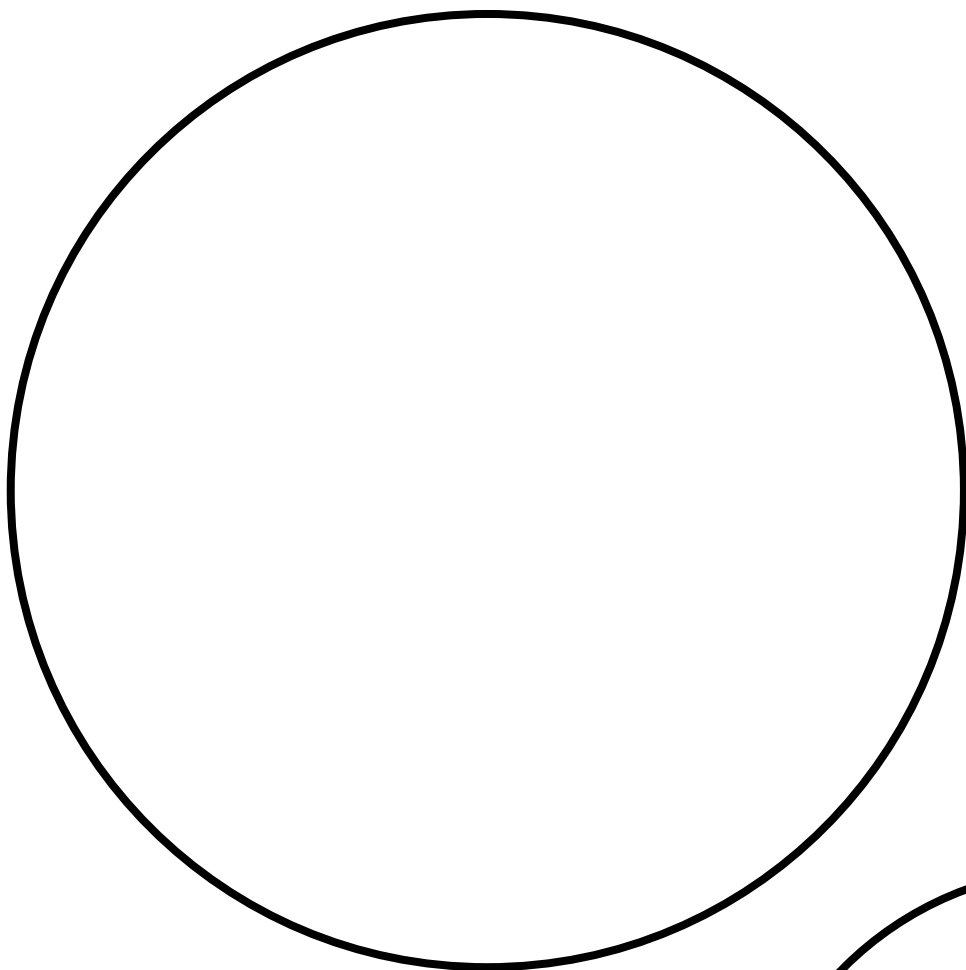
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**The Crust**

The outer layer of the Earth. It is comprised mostly of different types of rock.

**The Inner Core**

This is the hottest layer of the Earth, as well as the smallest. It is comprised of a solid ball of metal.

**The Mantle**

This layer is made up of two separate layers. The top of these two is made up solid rock. The second is made of a plastic like fluid.

**The Outer Core**

Comprised of liquid magma. Extremely hot because of its closeness to the inner core.

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
